DPWH, Capitol join forces for measures vs flooding



DPWH Secretary and Gov. Lilia Pineda lead a meeting with stakeholders and other government officials on anti-flooding measures.

CITY OF SAN FERNANDO — The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) and Pampanga officials have joined forces to pursue immediate, medium-term, and long-term measures addressing the province's persistent flooding problem.

During a meeting led by DPWH Secretary Vince Dizon, a comprehensive Flood Management Plan was presented to reduce the impact of flooding on communities, major roads, livelihoods, and the local economy. Pampanga Governor Lilia "Nanay" Pineda expressed the provincial government's full support for the proposed measures, noting the unified efforts of local mayors in finding solutions that can provide immediate relief and long-term protection to repeatedly flooded areas.

Immediate and short-term solutions
Three key interventions were identified:

- Close gaps along the Tulao River using FlexMac flood barriers
- Dredge existing waterways to improve water flow
- Pump accumulated floodwater toward waterways through pumping systems

BOC Clark seizes ₱10.7-M shabu hidden in wedding dress box

CLARK FREEPORT

— The Bureau of Customs - Port of Clark, in coordination with the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) and the Clark Inter-Agency Task Force Against Illegal Drugs, intercepted around 1.573 kilograms of suspected shabu valued at ₱10.696 million concealed inside the cardboard sidewalls of a wedding dress box.

The shipment, declared as "Wedding Dress," was sent from Mexico City, Mexico, to Mandaluyong City and was subjected to X-ray scanning by the BOC's X-ray Inspection Project after authorities

received derogatory information about the package.

The X-ray images showed suspicious findings, prompting customs authorities to conduct a physical examination.

Although the white wedding dress, including its ruffles, initially yielded no contraband, the assigned Customs Examiner noticed the unusual weight of the carton. Further inspection of the packaging led to the dismantling of the box, where four transparent plastic pouches containing a white crystalline substance were found

Porac lass gets perfect score in int'l Science Olympiad

PORAC, PAMPANGA

— A young Porac lass and Grade 9 student of the Philippine Science High School—Central Luzon Campus (PSHS-CLC) emerged as the top performer in Category A of the International Life Science Olympiad 2026, earning both a Gold Award and the Grand Award after posting a perfect score.

Mary Louize P. Carbungco, who hails from Barangay Sta. Cruz in Porac, scored a perfect 200/200, earning the highest score in Category A for Grades 7 to 9. Organizers described the feat as a record-breaking achievement.

Carbungco was named Grand Award winner for Category A, while Russell Kurniawan of Indonesia received the Grand Award for Category B, covering Grades 10 to 12.

The international competition was held September 3 to 6, 2026, in Bali, Indonesia, bringing together young science enthusiasts from seven countries: the Philippines, Indonesia, Mongolia, the United States, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan, and Bangladesh.

DSWD distributes over 1.75-M food packs in CL

CITY OF SAN FERNANDO — The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) has distributed a total of 1,756,607 Family Food Packs (FFPs) to families affected by prolonged rains and flooding across the seven provinces of Central Luzon.

The distribution comes as DSWD continues its response to weeks of heavy rains brought by recent tropical cyclones and the enhanced Southwest

Monsoon or habagat, which have affected communities across the region.

Flooding has damaged homes, disrupted livelihoods and commerce, and affected the normal flow of daily activities in several communities.

Through the coordinated efforts of its operations and administrative clusters, DSWD Field Office 3, in partnership with local government units (LGUs), continues to provide essential assistance to

affected families and individuals, particularly those facing food insecurity.

To ensure the availability of relief supplies, the agency maintains sufficient stocks of FFPs in its regional and satellite warehouses for immediate distribution to communities in need.

These efforts support the government's disaster response under the

Pep rallies to send off student-athletes in UAAP and NCAA

PEP RALLIES are in full swing as member-schools of two premier collegiate sports tournaments — University Athletic Association of the Philippines (UAAP) and National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) — officially send off their student-athletes.

Pep rallies are vibrant, high-energy community celebrations to fuel school spirit and to support members of the teams.

The UAAP is an athletic association of eight Metro Manila universities, composed of University of the Philippines (UP), Adamson University (AdU), Ateneo de Manila University (AdMU), De La Salle University (DLSU), Far Eastern University (FEU), National University (NU), University of the East (UE), and University of Santo Tomas (UST).

The NCAA is composed of Arellano University (AU), Colegio de San Juan de Letran, De La Salle-College of Saint Benilde (CSB), Emilio Aguinaldo College (EAC), José Rizal University (JRU), Lyceum of the Philippines University, Mapúa University, San Beda University, San Sebastian College-Recoletos, and University of Perpetual Help System DALTA.

Established in 1924, NCAA is the oldest collegiate athletic association in the country with its original members AdMU, De La Salle College, FEU, NU, San Beda, University of Manila, UP and UST.

UAAP was formed in 1938 when FEU, NU, UP, and UST left NCAA and became the original members of UAAP. Adamson and UE joined in 1952, followed by AdMU in 1978 and DLSU in 1986.

UAAP schools compete in 28 events from 15 sports to vie for the overall championship title.

First semester sports that run from August to December include athletics, badminton, basketball, beach volleyball, cheer dance, chess, E-sports, football, judo, swimming, table tennis, and taekwondo.

Second semester sports from January to May include baseball, fencing, softball, street dance, tennis, volleyball, and 3x3 basketball.

The NCAA schools compete in 14 sports: basketball, soccer, poomsae, swimming, taekwondo, track and field, chess, tennis (lawn and soft), table tennis, badminton, volleyball, and beach volleyball.

Each UAAP school has its own monicker: Soaring Falcons for Adamson, Blue Eagles for Ateneo, Green Archers for DLSU, Tamaraws for FEU, Bulldogs for NU, Red Warriors for UE, Fighting Maroons for UP, and Growling Tigers for UST.

The theme for UAAP Season 89 is “For Everyone” hosted by FEU while NCAA Season 102 is “Strive. Believe. Unite” hosted by San Beda University.

UP earlier hosted UAAP 12 times for seasons 13 (1949–50), 16 (1953–54), 20 (1957–58), 26 (1963–64), 31 (1968–69), 36 (1973–74), 42 (1979–80), 46 (1983–84), 54 (1991–92), 62 (1999–2000), 71 (2008–09) 78 (2015–16) and 87 (2024-25).

In Season 1 (1938-39), UP bagged three championship titles: baseball, volleyball, and athletics.

UP was overall champion five times: Seasons 40 (1977–78), 41 (1978–79), 43 (1980–81), 45 (1982–83) and 60 (1997–98).

In badminton, UP was champion 15 times: 10 in women’s and 5 in men’s, which is the highest number of titles among the UAAP schools.

In baseball. UP was champion 11 times, the first during Season 1 (1938–39) and the last in 68 (2005–06).

In basketball, UP has 12 titles: 4 in men’s, 7 in women’s and 1 in boys’. UP was champion in men’s in Seasons 2 (1939), 49 (1986-87), 84 (2022) and 87 (2024).

In cheer dance, UP is ranked second with 8 titles, following NU with 9.

In chess, UP was champion thrice: once in men’s and twice in women’s.

In fencing, UP was champion six times: once in men’s and 5 in women’s.

In football, UP was champion 21 times: 20 in men’s and once in women’s. The latest is in the men’s for Season 88 (2025–26).

In Judo, UP was champion 17 times: 5 in men’s and 12 in women’s.

In softball, UP has 4 titles.

In street dance, UP ranked top one with 5 titles: 2013, 2015, 2016, 2025, and 2026.

In swimming, UP has 41 titles, considered as the “winningest” team: 17 in men’s and 22 in women’s collegiate level, while two in girls’ high school division.

In table tennis, UP has 8 titles: 2 in men’s and 6 in women’s.

In taekwondo, UP has 2 titles: one each for women’s and poomsae.

In tennis, UP was champion 6 times in men’s.

In track and field athletics, UP was champion 25 times, 21 in collegiate and 4 in high school.

In volleyball, UP has 12 titles: 4 in men’s and 8 in women’s. The last was in Season 45 (1982–83) in women’s.

For Season 88, the podium finishes of the UP Fighting Maroons are Gold for women’s swimming and men’s football; Silver for fencing, judo, lawn tennis and softball for women’s while badminton, basketball, judo, and lawn tennis for men’s; Bronze for men’s athletics and fencing along with women’s badminton.

A campus anecdote was that the varsity teams were once known as the UP Parrots. It was replaced with a new moniker that revived the old (circa 1920s) name Maroons along with the adjective “fighting” to describe the sportsmanship attitude that the UP varsity teams must possess during the games.

immediate interventions were also highlighted for the San Fernando–Sto. Tomas–Minalin Tail Di­ke, Setback Levee in San Simon, Arnedo Di­ke in Macabebe, and sections of MacArthur Highway in Apalit.

Officials also discussed the damaged tail dike in Minalin, which could affect seven barangays and an estimated 20,000 to 30,000 residents.

The rising water level along Quezon Road was likewise raised as a concern, as the route serves as an alternative when traffic is heavy or portions of the North Luzon Expressway become impassable due to flooding.

Detention Basins for the Medium Term

For medium-term flood control, the DPWH plans to establish detention basins in San Simon and other areas.

These facilities will temporarily store excess floodwater before gradually releasing it into nearby waterways, following the “store, drain and release” concept.

The detention basins will preferably be located near rivers and areas with suitable slopes to facilitate drainage. Pumping systems may also be used when necessary.

Aside from flood control,

stored water could potentially serve as surface water and provide additional irrigation supply.

Dizon emphasized the need for cooperation between the provincial and local governments, particularly in securing right-of-way and necessary permits, so excavation and other works can begin as soon as weather conditions improve.

Major long-term projects

Among the long-term projects being pursued are:

- Central Luzon–Pampanga Floodway Project, including an estimated 60-kilometer floodway
- 12,000-hectare ring dike project
- Construction of silt or “sabo” dams in Nueva Ecija
- Manila Bay Integrated Flood Control, Coastal Defense and Expressway Project, currently undergoing a pre-feasibility study

Dizon noted that some of these major long-term projects could take up to 20 years to fully implement.

He stressed the need for immediate action while permanent solutions are being developed to prevent further escalation of flooding impacts on Pampanga communities.

“We are building the foundation of the Clark Advanced Manufacturing Park on a principle of shared progress. True development means no community is left behind,” he said.

Through the updated census, a validated community baseline will be established as a guide to determine appropriate assistance, safeguards, and other measures for communities in and around the area, as project preparations progress.

The census update is part of a process that includes the identification and validation of families, joint surveys and documentation, review of existing agreements, and

hidden within its cardboard sidewalls.

The substance weighed approximately 1,573 grams and had an estimated standard drug value of ₱10,696,400. Initial spectrometer screening indicated the presence of methamphetamine, commonly known as shabu.

Samples were turned over to PDEA Clark for laboratory analysis and confirmatory testing.

Customs Commissioner Ariel F. Nepomuceno stressed the need for vigilance as drug smugglers continue to develop sophisticated concealment methods.

“Mas nagiging madiskarte ang mga smugglers at minsan, sa unang tingin, parang walang kahina-hinala sa shipment. Kaya hindi tayo puwede maging kumpyansa—our Customs officers must remain sharp, thorough, and ready to check beyond what is immediately visible,”

ABI Center in Zambales

ZAMBALES — The Department of Agriculture Regional Field Office III (DA RFO III) will hold the groundbreaking ceremony for the Agribusiness Incubation (ABI) Center on October 1, 2026, at 8 AM at the DA–Research Outreach Station for Lahar-Laden Areas Development (DA-RSLL) in Barangay Rabanes, San Marcelino, Zambales.

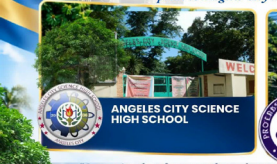

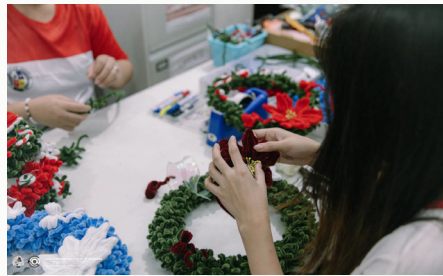
